LifeStones	<p>A lifelong, intentional process of spiritual development marked by milestones of measurable spiritual growth</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• LifeStone 1 : Babies-Twos• LifeStone 2 : Threes-Kindergarten• LifeStone 3 : 1st-3rd Grades• LifeStone 4 : 4th-6th Grades• LifeStone 5 : 7th-9th grade• LifeStone 6 : 10th-11th grade• LifeStone 7 : 12th grade
Campus Event	<p>A specific LifeStone commemoration in the local church; these events occur throughout our church year and provide opportunities to both partner with parents in teaching LifeStone truths and to celebrate LifeStone accomplishments</p>
Parent Actions	<p>LifeTalk, Family Celebration, God Moments</p>
Family Celebration	<p>A specific LifeStone commemoration in the home; these unique events are planned and celebrated by families as they progress through the LifeStone process</p>
LifeTalk	<p>An intentional faith development experience used by parents to guide their children toward life change; a family devotion</p>
God Moments	<p>Informal ways for parents to speak and model truth; reclaiming the daily circumstances of life as opportunities for spiritual growth</p>
Parent Seminar	<p>A parent and church partnership opportunity where parents are equipped to guide the spiritual training of their children during each LifeStone; these seminars can occur during Greenhouse, LifeGroups or at special times throughout the year</p>
Parent Summit	<p>A series of Parent Seminars; Parent Summits occur twice a year with a keynote speaker and specific LifeStone seminars</p>
Core Skills	<p>The clearly defined, biblical truths that a child, student or adult must learn as he or she progresses through the LifeStone process. Core skills are taught primarily by the parents and are reinforced by the church as the family moves through each LifeStone. Core skills include both knowledge attained and action displayed as the child, student, or adult learns to think and act like Jesus.</p>
